POSITION TITLE: Teacher for the Upward Bound and Upward Bound Math and Science Saturday Academy. Several openings in the following subject areas: English (9, 10, 11), Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science, Spanish, French, Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, Trigonometry and Calculus, History and SAT Test Prep.

CLASSIFICATION: Teacher (Non-Tenured, Term, Non-Exempt Contingent 1)

RESPONSIBILITIES: The Pre-College Programs is seeking an innovative, student-oriented candidate to teach in its 2016-2017 Saturday Academy. Specific responsibilities will include: developing syllabus and lessons that incorporate content specific information using active and cooperative learning strategies; providing hands-on activities in the assigned subjects and facilitated tutoring using a variety of instructional strategies; monitoring and evaluating student progress and attendance; preparing and submitting progress reports and program evaluations; and attending orientation and occasional staff meeting.

QUALIFICATIONS: Bachelor's degree in Education or a specific field required. Master's degree in related fields, preferred. At least three years of experience teaching high school students. Excellent, demonstrated verbal and written communication skills. Proven ability to work with a diverse faculty, staff and student population a plus.

SALARY: Salary ranges from \$136 to \$144 per Saturday, based on qualifications and experience.

POSITION DATES: Teachers are expected to be onsite for classes from 8:30 AM to 1:30 PM. Occasional meetings will occur from 2:00 PM to 3:00 PM.
